1. The Battn will be relieved on the night of the 26th/27th January in the right sector of the Brigade front by the 1st NLFD. Regt. in the right subsector and the 2/Hants Regt. in the left subsector and will proceed to the BRANDHOEK area. The 1/NLFD Regt. will take over Posts A to C inclusive in the front line with 1 Coy of 4 Platoons (No 1 Coy.) the position of the right platoon in close support with 2 platoons and the position of the right platoon in the GOUDBERG defences with 2 platoons (No 2 Coy).
The 2/Hants Regt. will take over Posts 10 to 15 inclusive in the front line with 3 platoons, the position of the left platoon in close support with 1 Platoon (2 Coy.) and of the left platoon in the GOUDBERG defences with 3 platoons (X Coy)
2. Platoon Guides as follows will meet the incoming Regts at SOMME, the 2/Hants at 4.45 pm, the 1st NFLDs at 5.30 pm.

These guides will guide their respective platoons back by No 5 Duckboard track, branching off on the newly laid tape line at right angles to the track which joins the road near to the Aid post MOSSELMARKT. The guides for the close support platoons and GOUDBERG Spur will lead their platoons straight to their positions. Guides for each post in the front line will take over each the garrison of his respective post at the Aid Post and guide them to their post by the directest route. Coy Commanders will tell off intelligent men for this task who know their way well and they will be at the Aid Post by 5.45 pm and will keep a careful look out for the incoming Battns and waste no time in taking charge of the garrisons of the Posts to which they are guiding. These Post Guides will report to Lt Rawkins at the Aid Post and be in his charge.

3. Coys will march independently to WIELTJE Route VINDICTIVE X Roads, there by tape to No 5 track, there to WIELTJE keeping as long as possible to the duckboards. Lt Rawkins will station a man at the junction of the tape with the VINDICTIVE X Roads – Bellevue Road to guide troops until the last man has passed. Coy Commanders must make their own arrangements for collecting their Coys together before reaching WIELTJE.

The Battn will entrain at WIELTJE at 1 a.m. Cookers (1 for RGLI & 1 for R.F.) will serve hot tea at the entraining point. Lieut Denton will superintend the entraining. 30 men per truck. On detrainment the 2/RF. will march under Capt Powell to 'B' Camp, the 1/RGLI to BRAKE CAMP

4. All trench stores etc. will be handed over and receipts obtained, which will be handed to the Adjutant at the entraining point.
The full complement of tools and petrol cans will be brought out of the line, and every man will carry some piece of salvage. These will be dumped at the end of the duck-board track and ~~receipts taken from the N.C.O. i/c & handed afterwards to the Adjutant.~~ collected later.
5. An ambulance will be at SOMME to pick up any men who are incapable of marching further.
6. Relief Complete will be reported by Coy. Commanders by runner to Bn. Hqrs. at MALLARD X roads after the last man has passed this point.

Relief Orders.2nd February 1918.

1. The 86th Brigade will relieve the 87th Brigade in the WIELTJE support area to-morrow, 3rd instant. The 1st R.G.L.I. will relieve the 1st K.O.S.B.'s in English Camp.
2. The Battn. will entrain at BRANDHOEK on two trains leaving at 2.30 p.m. and 2.40 p.m. A. B. & C. Coys. on the first train. Hdqrs. and D. Coy on the second train for WIELTJE, and march from there to English Camp. The Battn. will be formed up ready to move off on the road outside the Camp at 1.45 p.m., Order:- A. B. C. D. and Hdqrs. Head of the column, at the end of the road which runs through the Camp. Dress:- Full Marching Order, Steel Helmets, one blanket to be carried, great coats to be worn. A distance of one hundred yds (100x) will be maintained between Coys. Between here and BRANDHOEK Coys will march in fours. Between WIELTJE and English Camp in file.
3. The second blanket will be stacked neatly tied in bundles of ten at the side of the road W. of the Camp by 8.30 a.m. for conveyance by lorry. Officers' valises behind the Guard Tent by 11 a.m. for conveyance by limbers.
All Officers' or other kit which is not being taken up, will be stacked in a separate pile at the same place by 11 a.m. This will be conveyed to the Q.M. Stores on hand-carts by a fatigue party from the Drums.
4. One Lewis Gun and team of 6 per Coy. will proceed with one Lewis Gun Limber to the relief of four anti-aircraft guns of the 1st K.O.S.B.'s. Lieut Lainé will take charge of this party, which will march to English Camp starting at 9.30 a.m. their packs and blankets will be stacked with the blankets to go by lorry. They will carry one day's rations. The other three Lewis Gun Limbers will be loaded by 10 a.m.
L. Gun limbers, cookers, one water cart, mess cart, maltese cart, and tool limber will proceed by road under arrangements by the Trans. Officer. Rations will be issued at English Camp.
5. 2. Lieut. Street and 1 N.C.O. and 2 men per Coy. including Hdqr. Coy. will go on ahead by road to take over the accomodation in English Camp, and act as unloading party. They will start at 9.30 a.m. and take haversack rations. Their kits will be stacked to go by lorry. 2. Lieut. Street will also take over any stores from the 1st K.O.S.Bs.
6. This Camp will be left thoroughly clean, Coy Commanders reporting to this effect to the 2nd in Command before leaving.

7. Coys will report when they are settled in the new Camp.
8. A return showing description of accomodation, viz. No of nissen huts, tents, shelters, dug-outs, occupied by each Coy will be rendered to Orderly Room by 9.30 a.m. on the 4th inst.
9. C.Q.M.Ss' will proceed by the lorry to-morrow but will return at night, and will remain at the Q.M. Stores, bringing up rations every night. Coys will leave no other personnel behind.

4. Guides. 1 per platoon will meet B Coy at SOMME at 7 p.m. and will guide them by K track to Right Coy. Hqrs. where guides for each post will take them on.

1 per platoon will meet A Coy who will proceed by No 5 duckboard track, on the track at a point opposite BELLEVUE and will guide them to Left Coy Hqrs, where guides for the posts will be waiting for them.

1 per platoon will meet C Coy who will also proceed by No 5 track at the same place as A Coy and guide them to their posts.

D Coy will proceed by the road the whole way and will be met by platoon guides at the point where the CT meets the road at BELLEVUE.

5. Kits. Blankets, packs (with puttees inside) and Officers valises will be conveyed to the transport lines tomorrow. All blankets will be stacked on the side of the road by 9 a.m., packs by 11 a.m., and officers valises by 2 p.m. Overcoats will be put in the packs. Jerkins will be worn.

6. Anti Aircraft

The 5th Lewis Gun in each Coy will be mounted in each case in selected positions in the Support platoon. Details will be taken over by Coy Commanders.

7. Communications.

There will be a Battn relay runner post at MEETSCHEELE. Coys will send all messages etc. down to this post, whence they will be sent on to Battn Hqrs, by Hqr runners.

8. Reports.

The following reports are required at Battn Hqrs daily.

9. All defence schemes, trench stores etc will be taken over on relief and receipts forwarded to Battn Hqrs.

10. 5% of the Support Coy will be employed nightly on carrying R.E. material from MOSSELMARKT. to the Front Coys Hqrs.

The reserve Coy will furnish ration parties. 25% of the Reserve Coy will be at the disposal of the Tunnelling Coy nightly. Further orders will be issued.

11. Completion of relief will be reported to Battn Hqrs in B.A.B. code.

1. The 86th Bde will relieve the 98th Bde. tomorrow night the 3rd/4th in the left sector of the 33rd Divl. front. The 1/R.G.L.I. will take over the right Battn: front from the 2nd Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. The 1st LANCS. FUS. will take over the left Battn: front. The 2nd ROYAL FUSILIERS will be in reserve in the BELLEVUE line.

5. Rear Battn: Hdqrs will remain at WARRINGTON CAMP. The Q.M. and transport lines will be at I.3.D.2.4.

All blankets and packs (with puttees inside) will be stacked in the hut opposite the Orderly Room by 3 p.m. Officers' valises will be stacked in the adjoining hut at the same time.

6. Sandbags will be worn instead of puttees. Water bottles will be filled before starting. 2 days' rations will be carried. 8 Yukon packs will be carried each by B & D Coys.
7. Rations and water will be conveyed by transport to SEINE DUMP, whence they will be taken forward by carrying parties.
8. All details regarding runner relay posts, carrying parties etc, will be notified as early

as possible.

9. The fifth Lewis Gun will be mounted by each Coy. for A.A. purposes, exact positions will be notified to Bn: Hdqrs. with morning reports on the 4th inst.
10. Relief complete will be reported by B.A.B. code, if the wires are holding, if not by runner. In any case a runner from each Coy. will be sent to Bn: Hdqrs directly relief is complete.
