In reply to your communication of 12th March, last, relative to the report of burial of your son, the late No.215 Private V. C. BUTLER, 37th Battalion, it is noted with regret that you were inadvertently misinformed regarding the location of the Pont Du Hem Military Cemetery.

Owing to a typographical error the situation was shown as $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles North-south-west of Lille, whereas the actual position is more clearly defined as -

$1\frac{1}{2}$ miles South-west of Laventie.

Lille is situated approximately $12\frac{1}{2}$ miles East of the abovenamed Cemetery, and $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles South-south-east of Verlinghem where the remains of your son were formerly interred.




