Dear Madam,

In reply to your letter of the 1st instant, enquiring as to the state of the cemetery where Major A.H.P. Davey is buried, and more particularly as to the state of the grave, I regret I am not yet in a position to give you any information, but reports are now coming in on all the cemeteries in the re-occupied area and when I get the one about the cemetery in which you are interested, I will let you know further.

Owing to the very large number of enquiries, I fear it is not possible to obtain a report on every individual grave, but as soon as such can be obtained you will be duly advised.

I think I can say that pending the receipt of the reports mentioned above, as a general rule the Germans have not disturbed the cemeteries or individual graves, though of course some may have been damaged by shell-fire and other circumstances attending military operations.
