### **Jesuit Scholastic**

Brother of Georges Joseph Lucien De Geuser & Louis M.E. De Geuser (who was seriously injured in the war and had both legs amputated – he survived and was ordained a Jesuit Priest in 1918.)

Nephew of General Loyzeau de Grandmaison

Recorded in the “Les Anciens de Notre Dame de Bon Secours de Jersey et la Guerre” and entered the College Notre Dame de Bon Secours de Jersey in 1911.

**Awards:** Chevalier de la Legion d’Honneur (posthume), Croix de guerre

### **Citations:**

To the order of the division 15 May 1917 "Trained his men to their place of combat under a violent barrage. Braving the grapeshot, remained standing on the trench all the time of the attack. Established liaison with the elements on the right, to which he managed to send ammunition."

To the order of the 37th R.I. 1917 "The executives of his company being very tested, spent without counting. Did perilous patrols and brought back precious information." and 15 Sep 1918 "On July 20, 1918, led his section with the greatest bravery in pursuit of the adversary. Was mortally wounded at the end of the fight."

**Death:** Died of Wounds 25 Jul 1918 Hospital Evacuation No 10, Connantre, Marne

**Grave:** Necropole National Fere-Champenoise, Marne - Grave 1072

**Memorial:** Remembered on the French Consulate WW1 Board of Honour in Jersey (now located in St Thomas Church, St Helier, Jersey).
